



A Prayer Strategy for Women in Your Church

Below is a complete description of how to implement a prayer strategy among the women in your church:

Step 1: Create a list of the women involved in your church.

Step 2: Recruit a Prayer Team.

- Once volunteers are selected, divide the list of women equally among your prayer volunteers.
- Ask the volunteers to pray for the women on their list by name using a monthly guide.

Step 3: Choose an annual prayer theme.

Step 4: Select a monthly prayer focus to support the theme.

Step 5: Email the monthly focus to the prayer team and to all women in your church, inviting them to join in by praying on their own.

Sample Monthly Prayer Email

Annual Theme: Women Seeking Revival

Monthly Focus: Obedience to God

Sample email introduction:

August greetings to all!

In our year-long pursuit of personal revival, this month we turn our focus to obedience. This obedience is a response to who God is and what He has called us to so that He might be glorified. It's a right response to His love and care for us. You'll see the word **respond** in bold throughout the opening prayer below. Let its dark, thick font stick in your mind as both an invitation and responsibility to think and act according to God's Word because of who He is and all He has done.

Remember, you are being prayed for by name by a woman in our [your church name] family. These verses are being prayed over you to the One who wrote them, so we can be certain we are praying in His will. Will you join us? We need each other and we all need the Savior. May we respond with obedience to Him.

A prayer and heart response for August

Psalm 139:23–24

*Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts!
And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!*

Deuteronomy 10:1

You shall walk after the Lord your God and fear him and keep his commandments and obey his voice, and you shall serve him and hold fast to him.
