Quick Connect

Genesis 12:1-3 The Lord said to Abram: God from your land, your relatives, and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make you into a great nation, I will bless you, I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, I will curse anyone who treats you with contempt, and all the peoples on earth will be blessed through you.

Discuss: God told Abram to leave his home and go to a land He would show him. Would it have been hard to leave without knowing where God was taking you? What did God promise him?

Go Deeper

Passages to Read: Genesis 12:1-5

Abram and Sarai did not have any children. Becoming a great nation didn't seem possible. When God spoke to him again, Abram asked about it.

Genesis 15:1-6

Questions to Talk About

- What did God ask Abram to do? What things did God promise him?
- In Genesis 15:5-6, what did God have Abram do? What did God promise him?
- What was Abram's response in verse 6? Why would it have been hard for Abram to believe?
